From Andy's Desk...

What a great week we had, working alongside St Barnabas with a team of students from Moore College in Sydney to share Jesus for life with the people of Orange.

Thank you to everyone who worked so hard, and thank you to those of you who came along whether you are a Christian already or not yet convinced.

The theme of our week was: Got Questions? Meet Jesus! We took the opportunity to explore some of the big questions that people have about God, about Jesus, about life and about us. Lots of us have questions, even after we have been Christians for a long time. The Bible itself is full of questions: people asking God questions, and sometimes God asking people questions.

If *you* could ask God one question what would it be? Maybe the one question you are really interested in wasn't one of the questions we looked at in the week. In which case please come and ask. Or alternatively, come along to the Identity Course that we will be running next term down at St Barney's Church.

The Identity Course works through the eyewitness account of Jesus' life, death and resurrection that was written down by John, one of Jesus' closest friends - in the Bible it is called the Gospel according to John. John was someone who saw and heard Jesus in his three years of teaching and healing and doing extraordinary things; John was also there when Jesus died on the cross, and he was there when Jesus appeared three days later raised to life again. John was able to see him, hear him and even touch him (just to make sure!) before Jesus then returned to heaven where Jesus now reigns as King over all creation.

It means that John is an excellent guide to the truth about Jesus. And that is so important because Jesus claimed to be the source of all truth and life and the only way to God.


"Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. If you really know me, you will know my Father as well." John 14:6-7

Jesus claims to be the Way, that is, the *only* Way to come to God - he even adds that no one can come to God except through him, and that if we really know Jesus then we will really know God. He also claims to be the Truth - that means that somehow if we've never grappled with the question of who Jesus is and how our big questions relate to him, then we've not yet understood the truth. It also means that our questions about God will somehow find their answer in Jesus. And Jesus claims to be the Life. The bible tells us that Jesus created life in the beginning and that he will give eternal life to those who trust in him - which means getting to the truth about Jesus really is a matter of life and death!

So please do come along. We start on Wednesday 1 May at 7pm. You won't be asked to sing, or pray out loud. You don't even have to say anything - you could just sit and listen to what others say. And you could always give the first evening a try and if you don't like it then no need to come to any of the others.


Fellowship Groups
